DELHI POINTS OF INTEREST

Delhi Park: Clearview Lake

Situated near the Foley Rd entrance to Delhi Park, Clearview Lake is alive with activity and beauty. A walking path circles the lake and is used for exercise and park programs.

Delhi Senior Center/Community Center

The Dorothy J. Bruening Senior Citizens/
Community Center was originally opened on October
22, 1978. Named after Delhi Senior founder Dorothy J.
Bruening, the Center added an addition in 1984 with
another addition in 1988. The Senior Citizens/
Community center is the home of the Delhi Seniors
and can also be rented for parties or social events.

Delhi Township Fire Department and Museum

The Museum is operated and maintained by the Delhi Historical Fire Museum Society. The organization is comprised mostly of current and past members of the Fire Department. They are dedicated to the education of Delhi Township and surrounding communities in fire safety and prevention through fun and innovative programs associated with the fire museum. The Museum is housed inside Station 33, which is located at 697 Neeb Road. Open during normal business hour.

Five Points Park

Five Points Park is a quaint park located at what used to be a five-point intersection connecting Rapid Run Road and Neeb Road. Five Points Park hosts a beautiful gazebo which has been the backdrop for many wedding pictures. It is also a common place to see local artists creating their image of this beautiful setting.

Delhi Historical Society

In 1990, the Delhi Historical Society open the Farmhouse Museum, the 19th century former home of Mary Witterstaetter and the Charles and Joseph Witterstaetter Greenhouses. The Farmhouse features three first floor rooms with changing exhibits, while the second floor features the Family Research Library for those researching their family roots on Cincinnati's West side.

Floral Paradise Gardens

This outdoor area is designed to pay tribute to the floral community that helped Delhi earn the nickname "The Floral Paradise of Ohio". There are 22 theme gardens consisting of a butterfly garden, an herb garden, a children's garden, backyard garden themes, perennial of the year garden, rose garden, etc. Each of the gardens is linked together by a series of paths that also connect to an existing walking trail from the adjacent Delhi Park.
